Crisis Accommodation in the Camden Haven



In the 2021 year to date, Community at 3 has worked with a total of 116 individuals in need of Crisis or Short-term housing. We, alongside other Government and Non-Government organisations have struggled to find placements through traditional methods i.e., Shelters, Estate Agencies, existing group style homes.

Our data includes only those who have approached us and does not include those who are couch-surfing, living in vehicles or camping out in state forests.

The data is even more frightening when you understand that 36 children are included in our figures.

We believe the time has come to address this situation by purchasing an accommodation property in the

Camden Haven that will be used to provide Short-term and Crisis housing to address the needs of our community.

To begin this process, we have called a Public Meeting of interested, involved, and motivated people to

"Think Tank" the work needed to move the project into a reality. We believe that your attendance would

enhance our knowledge and understanding of both the issue and complexity of the task ahead.

Building our community into a stronger, more supportive and inclusive entity relies on each of us
to help with the heavy lifting. We would appreciate not only your attendance at the "Think Tank" but also your

energetic support in spreading the word through your networks.

Another homeless flood victim's story

Josaia and Kerry lived in a house they owned at Brigadoon Caravan park when the floods hit earlier this year. Not only was their home destroyed but Josaia lost his wheelchair. We made an approach to the **Rotary Club of Laurieton**, and with their usual generosity, Josaia has a new wheelchair. As well, we have been working hard looking for suitable temporary accommodation for Josaia and Kerry while their home is rebuilt. Their friends accommodated them for 3 months and, upon our request the government has paid for one month's accommodation, which expires on Friday 29/10. The insurance company said their home rebuild could be up to another 12 months. We will continue to help.

And the flood affects continue

Many think that for the 2021 Camden Haven Flood victims, all should be back to normal by now. No, there are so many who continually contact Community at 3 seeking help as a direct result of the floods. Alex and Rosalie are such a couple. Their home has been so damaged that they now reside in their garage. Another of our partners, the North Haven Baptist Church, together with an anonymous lady donor, provided the funds for an air conditioner to enable them to endure living in their garage in Summer conditions. Another partner, the "Serve Team" of the Camden Haven Anglican Church are installing a cover over the entrance, to also keep out more heat. Like so many without the cover of expensive flood insurance, Resilience NSW have said that it may be up to two years before their home can be repaired, however, they are most thankful that at least they have a garage in which to reside in the meantime.
