MESSAGE FROM OUR PATRON, DR. SAM NELAPATI

It is an amazing privilege to be the patron of this beautiful organisation. Community at 3 has grown as an arm of the Lord, reaching out to those who need help. A loving collaboration between the leadership, volunteers and the supporting community at large is fast becoming a model for other organisations far beyond our local area. Looking forward to greater service to our community and in newer ways to reach those in need.

CRISIS & SHORT TERM ACCOMMODATION (CASTA)

The Camden Haven is in the middle of a housing crisis. An average of 5 people per week are contacting us for assistance to find crisis and /or short-term accommodation solutions. That's over 250 people per year desperately seeking somewhere to rest their head at night. This figure is made up young families, single men and women, retired people, teens and Domestic Violence survivors.



Community at 3, with the support of 61 attendees at a meeting in Dec 2021, are working toward the establishment of an Accommodation venue to house our guests in crisis. This will mean the purchase of a Caravan Park, Motel or the development of an alternative style property. To achieve this, we have developed a simple Strategic Plan based on teams of volunteers working together to raise sufficient funds to make the initial purchase and then manage. the property to make it a self-funded home for up to 20 families.

Over the next month or so we will be looking for volunteers to join our work teams. These teams include Team Churches, Team Schools, Team Clubs, Team Retailers, Team Grant Writers, Team Philanthropists, Team Government, Team Finance, Team Charities and Team Media. Once our teams are established each will be developing a plan of fund-raising activities, approaches to Government, Grant Applications, media coverage and a host of events to build a sense of community around the eventual development of our housing solution.

JUNE RELF - another of our wonderful Volunteers

Born in 1935 and at 87 (age disclosed with permission) **June** has been a regular Volunteer with Community at 3 for the past 5 years. Always helpful, always pleasant to work with and simply a joy to have around, June has lived in the Camden Haven for 50 years, initially working at the North Haven school and serving the community in many ways: as Parish Secretary at the Camden Haven Anglican Church for 20 years under 4 Ministers & helping run the Laurieton Legacy Health Centre for many years. She was treasurer of the Laurieton Frank Whiddon Homes project from its construction commencement until completion of the hostel some 20 years later, when she then became the Village committee chairperson

until 2000. She was instrumental during this period in helping to raise \$80,000 for the local Men's Shed. June delights in continuing to serve others in the Camden Haven and finds great satisfaction in giving of herself in this way.

Here is a photo of June with the Mobile Scooter she gave away to John, who was in great need when he lost his scooter in flood waters in 2021.

When June first arrived in the area, all those years ago, her late husband, Arthur, suggested they "didn't need to get involved". It has been a very good thing for our community that June ignored that advice.
