David wrestled with life, and his internal challenges were great, but he was also gentle, intelligent, loving, wise and concerned for all people. Those who knew him loved him and will miss him. Laurieton will be a poorer place without him. He trusted Jesus and so we trust he is now in God's everlasting arms. Rob Dwyer at the LUSC approved our planting of an Acacia tree behind the Club with a plaque (currently being made) in David's memory (see photo at right).
