So, what will our Van "Sunny" be used for?

- To collect and deliver food to people in need and when circumstances prevent them from attending at a BBQ meal, such as during Covid-19 lock downs
- To transport food provisions for our weekly BBQ meals
- Assisting with home relocations

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- To drive anyone in need to somewhere where other transport is otherwise costly, unavailable or greatly inconvenient and to transport people to group outings
- For anyone wishing to be picked up to attend a BBQ meal and returned back
- 4 Conveying members of our Community and others to church services where other transport is unavailable
- 4 Assisting with heavy deliveries to those in need, where no alternative means reasonably available
- For general use in assisting those in special need in the Camden Haven area: the homeless, disadvantaged, elderly, those vulnerable and the underprivileged who cannot source alternative transport solutions.
