FINANCIAL STRAIN CAN IMPACT ANYONE

Colin & Christine have been part of our Community at 3 family for some time. They are now pensioners after having enjoyed a life of interesting jobs: Colin was a cashier with a travel agent for 21 years in Sydney and Canberra and a Senior Supervisor with an Ex-Services Club in Cootamundra for 19 years. After obtaining his Bachelor of Health Science (Mental Health) at Charles Sturt University in Wagga, he worked as an Aboriginal Liaison Officer for Canberra Hospital. As well as being mother to a boy and 2 girls, Christine was a Paramedic for 10 years. Colin receives an age pension and Christine a Carer's pension as Colin's carer. Financial stress began when health problems impacted them both, especially Colin. He has had heart issues, diabetes, two knee surgeries and an assident in 2020 which has resulted in serious disc problems in his back. Their say



accident in 2020 which has resulted in serious disc problems in his back. Their savings has been drained with the many costs associated with their health procedures. As well, their mental health has also been drained as a result of both health and financial pressures. The fact that the pension is not meeting the rising cost of everything is a problem not unique to them only – it is a major issue for so many. Although owning their own home in a Retirement Village, the costs associated with that are causing them to consider having to sell the home. One bright light in their lives is the pending birth in August of their first grandchild. They also enjoy the friendship of the Community at 3 weekly BBQ where they can receive a free meal and some food to help lower their weekly bills. Colin & Christine said that they feel very welcomed each week and know that people care about them and there are always Volunteers willing to sit down for a chat.
