Alf Johnston was transferred in his work from Dorrigo, with his wife, to assume the role of District Forrester in charge of the local area. Alf then proceeded to complete building a home and settled in. However, sometime later the position he held was withdrawn and Alf lost his job. Alf and his wife then decided to travel extensively overseas. In 1988, Alf's wife developed MS and was wheelchair bound until she passed away 5½ years ago. Up until then Alf was her full-time Carer. They were married for 52 years. Shortly after that, Alf developed issues with his eyes and now has about 20% vision. Alf has been very active in community organisations including Probus, the local Family History Group and most recently as President of the local Lions Club. Alf has known Lorrae (a member of the band Flamingo, which entertains at the BBQ each fortnight) for many years. Someone mentioned the weekly Community at 3 BBQ meal and get together to Alf a couple of years ago. Alf thought he would turn up and see what it was like. He even offered to pay for his meal, something the Volunteers thought quite amusing at the time. I asked Alf why he always comes every week. He replied: "I enjoy the company". It's always great to see you Alf.



THE NEEDY ARE GROWING IN NUMBER

- ✓ The cost to **Community at 3** of supporting over 150 people over Christmas last was more than \$15,000 (an average of \$100pp). That included food parcels, shopping vouchers, accommodation, fuel etc. Less than \$80 of that amount was given as cash. We discern carefully and give in kind, rarely in cash. We are helping more people than ever.
- ✓ In particular, 6 people were transported to Hospital appointments, 3 families were re-united (we love when this happens), permanent accommodation was found for 8 people, 2 homeless people moved to new accommodation, 2 permanent jobs were found, and grief support was given to 2 families where sudden death was experienced.
