CHEEKY GWYN RISES ABOVE ADVERSITY

Gwyn has been a fixture at Community at 3 since the 3rd time it met, back in early 2017. During that time, she has undergone extensive cancer treatment – which is currently under control. Her arthritis is bad though, as the medication for that is incompatible with the cancer medication and she has to cease taking it. But Gwyn has a positive outlook, born of adversity, and her cheeky good nature is enjoyed by all.

Gwyn does not come to Community at 3 because she cannot get by financially. As she said to me, "I'm ok since alcohol and drugs are no longer part of my life. I first came here because I was new in the area and didn't know anyone. What I found here was food I like, and a very non-threatening environment - something I very much value as I suffer from anxiety attacks and PTSD, as well as numerous other health issues. I have watched changes in different people who have come here. I now see families here, revealing the

stress that is on society now. But this makes me realise that my life isn't really that bad after all. This is a Christian organisation, but I have never felt any pressure in that regard – even though I actually read a Bible that one Volunteer gave me some years ago. I have even offered my services as admin, if the motel for the homeless comes to fruition. And I truly love the Volunteer ladies. Some of them have become my good friends."
